Our beginning balance for March was \$34,507. During the period we had \$3,962 in total income. We received \$3,260 for membership dues, \$555 for education classes and \$237 for open room cash receipts. We also had a holiday party receipt adjustment of \$90. Facility expenses for the period were \$683, mainly attributable to non-capital hardware expenses of \$346 and printing supplies of \$137.

The resulting cash balance at the end of the period was \$37,786. On March 28th, one of our CDs will mature in the amount of \$10,429. Our second CD, currently valued at \$21,393 will mature on April 15th.

Speaker Introduction:

Toni Valenstein introduced Beaufort County Sheriff's officer Lieutenant Eric Calendine. His presentation on SCAM, both electronic and by phone, explored methods currently being used by scammers. Older citizens are often the target audience for scams.
